Maine Behavioral Healthcare invites you to attend a **free** training to increase capacity for working with infants, youth and their caregivers.

The FAN approach, a communication tool for professionals working with families, was developed by Erickson Institute professor Linda Gilkerson and her Fussy Baby Network team as part of their work to support parents dealing with challenging infant behaviors, such as crying, difficulty sleeping, and feeding. Over the last 10 years, the FAN has become a national model for family engagement and reflective practice, and is being adapted to more settings serving children.

Participants will:

- Learn about a structured approach to working with caregivers of infants and young children
- Learn reflective tools to increase effective communication with caregivers
- Increase family engagement and reflective practice skills
