This 12-hour curriculum (6 hours each day) was developed collaboratively by the Maine Coalition to End Domestic Violence and partners in the mental health field in order to meet the 2020 domestic violence training requirements for Licensed Clinical Social Workers, Licensed Clinical Professional Counselors, and Psychologists (L.D. 1238, 126th Legis. 2013). The four three-hour modules include information that will help mental health professionals be prepared to work with people who are experiencing abuse and violence. Technical assistance / case consultation will be offered following completion.
