WHAT: Annually, on one night in January, there is a count of all homeless people throughout the state of Maine.

WHY: Counting families, youth, veterans, senior citizens and others who are homeless gives us a better understanding of the factors contributing to homelessness in our communities. The information collected helps us in our work to end homelessness.

HOW: On the night of **Tuesday, January 28, 2020**, compassionate volunteers will be available throughout Maine to survey homeless members of our communities.

On **Wednesday, January 29, 2020, Thursday, January 30, 2020 and Friday, January 31, 2020**, volunteers will be located at various service centers throughout Maine to meet with homeless people and gather important information for the count.
