
Wabanaki Voices: Little People of the Dawn with Sapiel and Tomah

Minquansis Sapiel and Dwayne Tomah will read Sapiel's book, Little People of the Dawn in both English and Peskotomuhkati. Illustrated by Sapiel's child Minsoss Sapiel-Bobadilla, this is a beautiful Peskotahmokahti (Passamaqoddy) story about a young girl who comes upon the little people and a lesson in the need to preserve our languages and cultures.





Minquansis Sapiel is a member of the Peskotomuhkati Nation and a mother of three children with a Masters in Social Work. She grew up in the Sipayik community, has her Boat Captain's license, and offers whale watching tours.



Dwayne Tomah is a language keeper and Director and Curator of the Sipayik Museum. He is a teacher of Peskotomuhkati (Passamaquoddy) language and culture. He is the youngest fluent speaker of the Peskotomuhkati Nation and has served on the Tribal Council.
