



Point-In-Time Count Volunteer Opportunity



What is the Point-In-Time Count (PIT Count)?

The Point-In-Time Count is an annual survey required by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to identify individuals in our communities who are experiencing homelessness. The Homeless Services Hub Coordinators organize these counts for their respective hubs under the oversight of the Maine Continuum of Care (MCoC).

When is the PIT Count?

The count will take place on the evening of **Monday January 26, 2026**, beginning at sundown. Additional data collection will occur from **Tuesday-Friday, January 27 through January 30, 2026**.

How You Can Help!

Volunteer:

We are seeking volunteers for the night of the PIT and services days. Volunteers will work in teams to administer brief surveys and distribute warm items and food to individuals experiencing homelessness. Training will be provided, including instruction on using the “Counting Us” mobile application.

Volunteers must register through the MaineHomelessPlanning.org website and by selecting Maine Point in Time on the top banner. Registration will remain open until **one week before the count**.
